SUBJECT: Aircraft Marking for the 671st Bombardment Squadron (D)
TO : Commanding Officer, 416th Bombardment Group (L), Army Air Base,
Will Rogers Field, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

By authority delegated to the Commanding General, Army Air Forces, By AG Letter 400.161 (12-7-42) OB-3-A, Dated December 19, 1942, the following Insignia for the marking of aircraft of the 671st Bombardment Squadron (L), Army Air Forces, is approved:

AIRCRAFT MARKING: On a blue disc, border yellow, a large red aerial bomb, falling to base, entwined by a winged snake yellow, back of yellow and red diamonds, mouth and forked tongue red, fangs white, as per record drawing.

The insignia will face toward the front of the aircraft.

SIGNIFICANCE: The winged snake symbolizes the deadly striking ability of the squadron, while the yellow border and the yellow snake represent the squadron color.

HISTORY: The 671st Bombardment Squadron (L) was constituted January 25, 1943, by AG 320.2 (1-24-43) OB-I-AF-M, Dated January 25, 1943, and made active February 5, 1943.

This unit has no other history and is not entitled to battle honors.
