### DESCRIPTION OF ACCIDENT

(Brief parrative of accident. Include statement of responsibility and recommendations for action to prevent repetition)

### NARRATIVE:

On October 15, 1944, Lt. Leishman took off at 0648, a wing man in a six ship formation. Shortly after take off bad weather moved in closing the field. When the formation let down through the overcast Lt. Leishman lost the flight. All ships were diverted to 4-61, but Lt. Leishman could not be contacted. It 0845 ship #41-39196 piloted by Lt. Leishman crashed eight and five tenths miles from Sezanne on Nagent-Sur-Siene Highway.

The ship struck a large tree in a bank and about a thirty degree dive. It is apparent the pilot was making an instrument descent turning to the left for better forward visibility when he struck the side of the hill.

The terrain in the vicinity of the crash ishilly and very wooded.

### RESPONSIBILITY:

Error of technique. The pilot let down lower than a safe altitude on instruments.

### RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recommended that all pilots should be cautioned not to exceed a minimum safe altitude to clear the highest point or object in the vacinity in an instrument let down.

Statement of Mr. Rmile Lemaire, Forest Guard.

Airplane accident on the 15 October 1944 at 08:45 A.M., I was on road N 51, occupied in my work when I heard an airplane coming from the south, flying low because of mist. I stopped to watch it. When I heard the cracking and breaking of the branches of the trees. At this moment I saw the sirplane which was at my height and above the road, motors running quickly, full speed. I threw myself on stomache in the ditch that borders the road. I saw the airplane bank and then plunge into the woods in which it crashed some meters from me. Right away after it hit the ground I heard the cry of a man and suddenly the airplane took fire. Wishing to sid them, I had to crawl on my stemach because of the explosions of the Machine -gun bullets caused by the heat. It was like a machine-gun barrage. I couldn't approach the sides of the plane until the fire was over. Then I saw the three bodies ha lf burnt.

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
